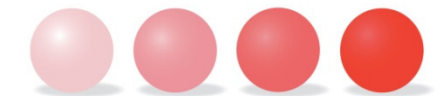
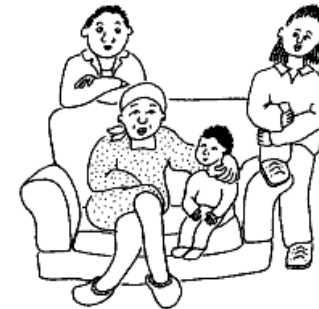


TSP: Beyond SAQ2 - Year 3 Resources, Support and Hub Activity

Year 2 Self Assessment Questionnaire Results

- 151 out of 152 Year 2 SAQs were returned
- 143 local areas now meet minimum standards.
- 99% of local areas are better at involving disabled young people and their families.
- Over 90% of local areas work together (health, education and social care) to support young people in growing up.

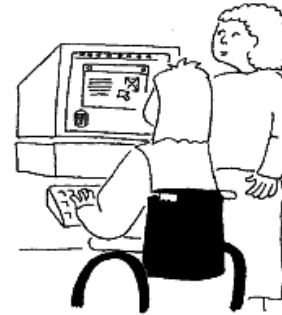

- 2) Development of Individual Budgets remains in early stages for many children's services

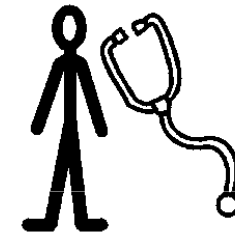
What's working well?

1) 50% of LAs have multi agency transition teams (virtual or actual)

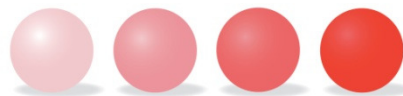
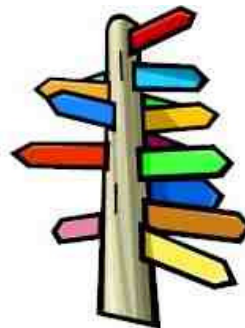
2) Health Action Plans completed in 120 LAs – some better than others

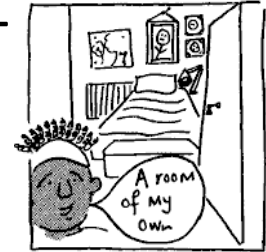
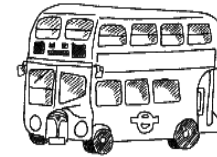

Post 16 Opportunities



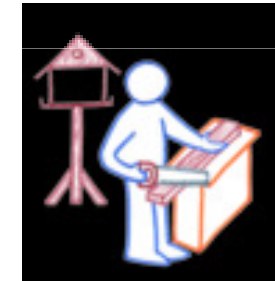
1) More Housing Departments in transition planning – quality of provision still low.



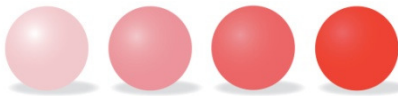
2) Increase in travel training

5) Many local areas mention Youth Strategy but little information provided on joint working and proactive planning.



What's working well?

Strategic Multi Agency Working

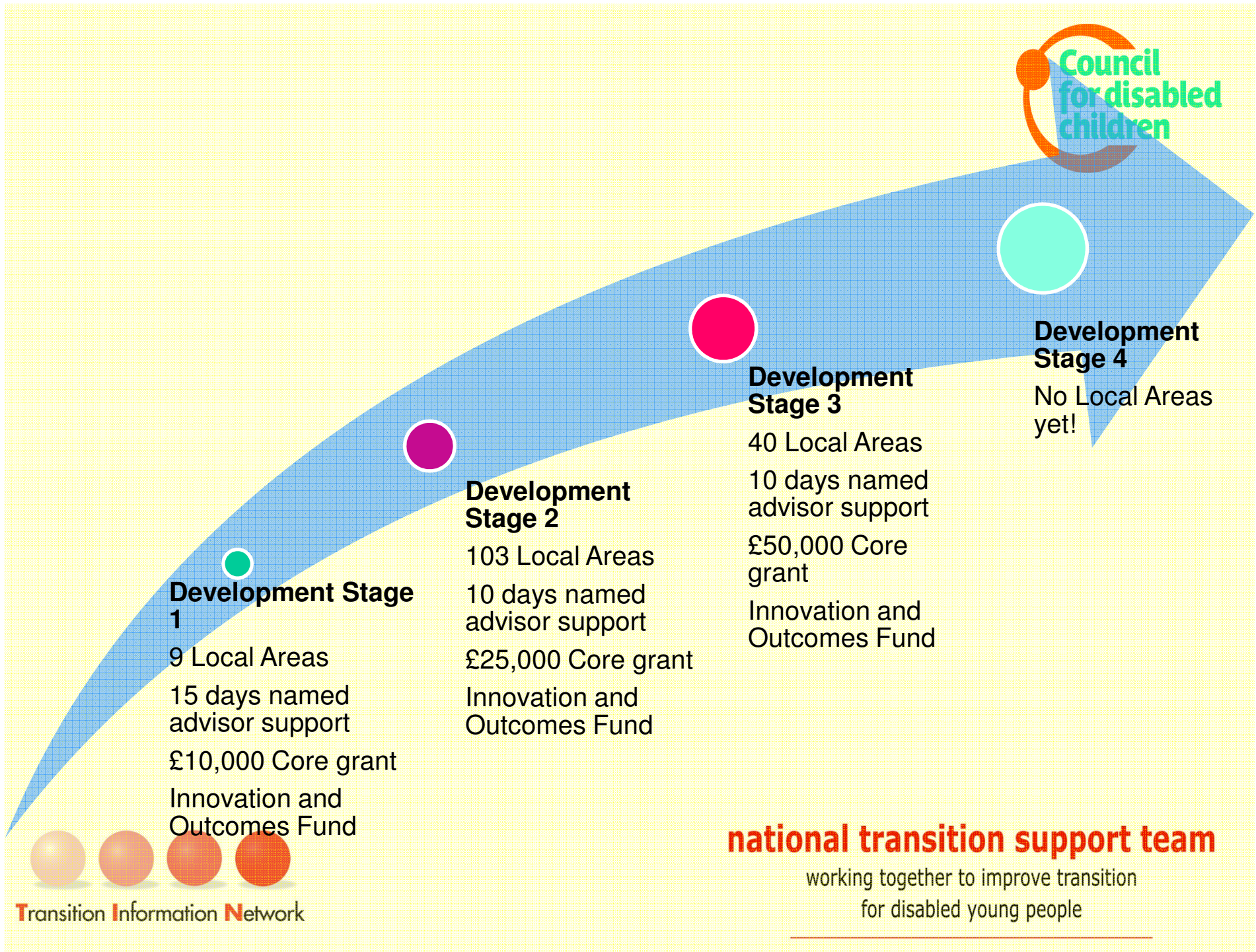


- 1) 99% of LAs have protocol in place or in development
- 2) 99% have Strategic Planning Group with core multi agency membership
- 3) Some strategic groups still struggle to get the level of senior management sign up required.
- 4) Many strategic groups still struggle to get wide range of agencies attending or the key representative from agencies attending.

Embedding TSP within the agenda for ‘Lasting Change’

- **Moving from minimum standards in transition processes to innovation and best practice and positive outcomes for disabled young people.**
- **Strategic embedding of transition in planning across services**
- **Linking up AHDC Programmes and other initiatives (GAL, Right to Control, Individualised Health Budget Pilots) for increased impact.**
- **Working strategically in Regions with Government Office and Strategic Health Authorities**
- **Leaving a sustainable regional support structure for transition**
- **Increased engagement of disabled young people and families in transition planning (individual and strategic)**

- **Moving responsibility to local areas in Year 3**
- **Focus on embedding improvements**
- **4 Development Stages**
- **Turns 'offers' around and gives top group something to aim for**
- **Provides increased focus on work beyond the programme**



9 local areas

- **Up to 15 days Named Advisor support**
- **£10,000**
- **Local areas that are not meeting all statutory requirements, meeting limited areas of guidance, have little evidence of good practice or innovation, have little or no evidence of development potential and their Named Advisor verifies that there are limited effective transition processes in place and little progress is being made.**
- **Expected to:**
 - Attend regional events.
 - Develop case studies
 - If appropriate contribute to good practice workshops at regional events.

103 local areas

- **Up to 10 days Named Advisor support**
- **£25,000**
- **Local areas are meeting most statutory requirements, some guidance requirements, demonstrate good practice across 2 or 3 priority outcomes with some innovative practice, have some evidence of potential for development and their Named Advisor has verified that some transition processes are effective and progress is being made.**
- **Expected to:**
 - Attend regional events.
 - Contribute to good practice workshops at regional events.
 - Input to development of case studies with support from Named Advisor.

40 local areas

- **Up to 10 days Named Advisor support**
- **£50,000**
- **Local areas that are meeting all statutory requirements, the majority of guidance requirements, demonstrate good practice and innovation across the 5 priority outcomes, have demonstrable evidence of potential for development and their Named Advisor has verified that transition processes are effective.**
- **Expected to:**
 - Attend regional events.
 - Act as transition promoters in region.
 - Run good practice workshops at regional events.
 - Input to development of case studies.
 - Offer mentoring to other areas in region.

Development Stage 4

The National Strategies

no local areas – yet

- **No funding allocation**
- **Local areas that are meeting all statutory and all guidance requirements**
- **Have leading practice in all 5 focus areas**
- **Strong leadership and creative solutions**
- **Active strategic involvement across key agencies**
- **Demonstrable sustainability in services**
- **Expected to:**
 - **Lead and promote regional network**
 - **Share learning on linking with other AHDC work and wider mainstream agenda locally**
 - **Lead work in participation of disabled young people in and beyond AHDC**

- **Opportunity for all local areas to access additional funding**
- **Up to £20,000 per application**
- **Quick process to ensure local areas have maximum time to plan spending and gives enough time for second round later in year if take up is low**
- **Applications open NOW**
- **Local areas with support of Named Advisors will complete application form**
- **NTST administer process**
- **All partners will decide on allocation**

Regional Support

- **SEN Hubs to lead in Year 3 on networks and events**
- **Additional capacity in NS Named Advisor time**
- **Plans for Year 3 activity to:**
 - **Support and maintain networks**
 - **Provide relevant events**
 - **Influence strategic planning beyond the programme
e.g. with Government Office for Regions and SHAs**

Practical Steps

- Focus on regional work
- Work with Hubs in regions on a programme for coming year linked to KPI's covering:-
 - Local themes
 - National themes
- Programme plan to include `how' and `what' around priorities
